To join Navy Cadets you must:

- Be a resident of Australia.
- Be in the year of your 13th birthday, but no older than 18 years.
- Provide a statement from your doctor confirming you are able to participate in Cadet activities.
- Not be a member of any other Cadet organisation or the Australian Defence Force.
- Be able to attend activities of the Training Ship you wish to join.
- Agree and abide by the ANC Code of Conduct
- Complete an application form and have it signed by a parent or guardian.
- Have your application accepted by the Training Ship Commanding Officer.
